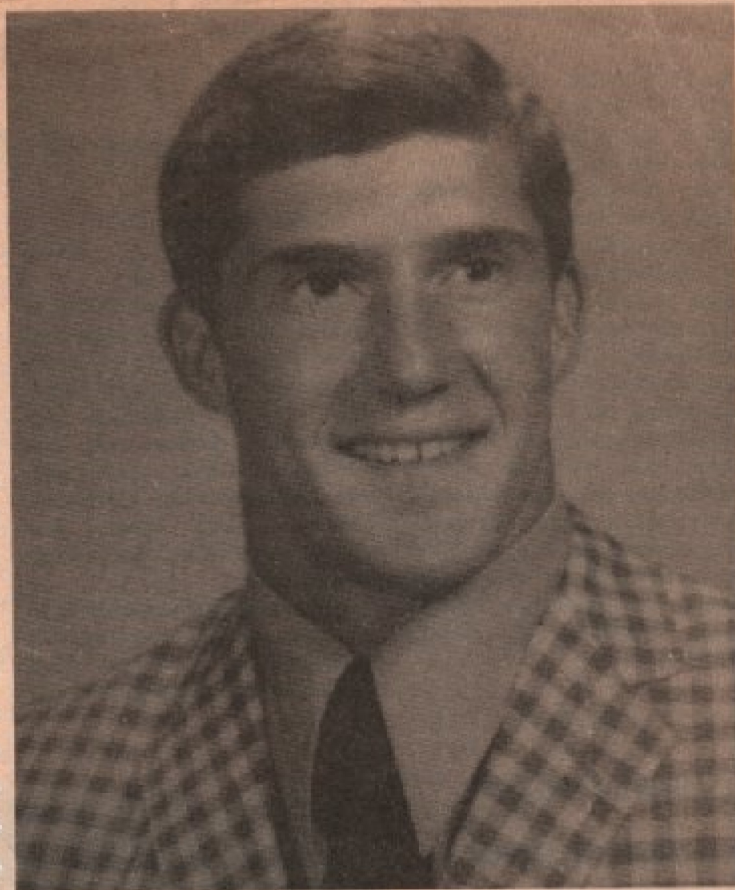
WE ARE ONE IN THE SPIRIT

## Thousand teens goal of fellowship breakfast

A thousand teens is the attendance goal set by the sponsors of the first annual DeKalb County United Teen Fellowship Breakfast to be June 15, nine a.m., DeKalb High School. Garrett, DeKalb, Eastside, and Hamilton high schools will participate.

Tickets are one dollar and can be bought at Best Pharmacy, Garrett, Higley Book Store, Butler, Hargers Market, Hamilton and Keltsch Pharmacy, Auburn.

Guest speaker will be John A. Roush, assistant football coach at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, where he is a graduate student in educational administration, and Summa Cum Laude graduate of Ohio University, Athens, Ohio.

His senior year in college Roush was selected "Christian

Athlete of the Year," college division, for "athletic excellence, academic achievement and Christian commitment while meritoriously competing in the uniform of faith."

Roush was a fullback for the varsity football team for three seasons and played varsity his sophomore, junior, and senior years. Amidst all this activity he kept a 3.75 grade point average.

On July 30, 1972 he appeared on the Billy Graham Crusade in Cleveland and gave a five minute testimonial; the program was telecast on national television as part of the Billy Graham Series on November 30, 1972.

He was the recipient of many athletic and academic awards during his college career, along with several religious, service, and military honors.

## Trester Award winners teen breakfast guests

The winners of the 1974 Indiana High School Basketball Tournament's coveted Trester Award, Don and Jon McGlocklin, Franklin, Ind., will be special guests at the First Annual DeKalb County Teen Fellowship Prayer Breakfast Saturday, June 15 at DeKalb High School. An attendance of at least 1,000 DeKalb County teens is the goal for the organizers of the event, which will begin at 9 a.m.

The McGlocklin twins were accomplished athletes at Franklin High School until their graduation this year, and will attend Butler University on basketball scholarships. At Franklin, they received a total of 15 varsity athletic letters, and were members of the student council, National Honor Society, and Hi-Y.

Jon was president, and Don was vice-president of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes during their senior year. The

Franklin basketball team advanced to the State Tournament Finals in 1973 and 1974; this year, the McGlocklins won the Arthur Trester Award, for scholastic accomplishment and citizenship.

They were also named Greater Indianapolis Area Christian Athletes of the Year, and National Christian Athletes of the Year in 1974. They have been named to numerous All-State and All-Tournament teams during the past two years.

Featured speaker at the Teen Fellowship Breakfast will be John Roush, former Christian Athlete of the Year at Ohio University who is now Assistant Football Coach at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.
